

PIZZA LUNCHES/DAY CHANGE

***All pizza lunches cost \$2 per week and will include a slice of cheese pizza and a beverage. All orders must be paid for in cash to the office (please do not leave cash in the mailbox with the tuition checks) by no later than Monday morning each week! We cannot accommodate pizza lunch for children if you request after 10 am each Monday. Some families find it easier to order pizza lunches by the month and that is fine with us, whatever makes it easier for you. If you signed your child up for pizza and they are absent, we cannot credit them for another week. The advance ordering system means that if you requested a pizza lunch, then it was ordered for your child regardless if they show up to school that day. There will be no exceptions as all orders need to be placed in advance in order for our pizzas to be prepared and ready before the pizza shop even opens to the public. Please note that pizza lunches will stop during the summer months. Your consideration regarding this is much



SICK POLICY-PLEASE READ...

Cold and Flu season is here and our main goal is to keep all of our children and staff healthy. Please refer to our sick and medication policy in your Parent Handbook if you need clarification regarding if your child should be at the center. We will send unwell children home in the event they have any of the listed symptoms while here at our center. All children sent home must spend 1 full symptom free day at home before returning to the center (no note is necessary if they don't need a doctor's visit or if they have been symptom free a full 24 hours) If your child does see a doctor and is being treated with ANY antibiotics, they must have a full 24-hour course of said antibiotic before they return to school. Meds that are needed in excess of 2 times a day can be given at the center but need to come to school in the bottle with the original prescription label. Please see us in the office if we can help you with any questions. If your child is complaining they are not feeling well (especially if they are not a complainer) we ask that you act on the side of caution so as not to infect the others in our center.

Your assistance and consideration are greatly appreciated regarding illness. It takes a village. Always remember that handwashing is the key to a healthy life, so please direct your children to the sink daily at drop off and before you take them home to wash away those pesky germs.
